- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 2 (a) There is a tuition assistance program under this subtitle for use by 3 students at institutions of higher education in the State who:
- 4 (1) Work as direct service employees in a community-based program; or
- 5 (2) Agree to work as direct service employees in a community-based 6 program in the future.

- 8 (a) A student shall be required to repay the State any funds received under 9 the Program if the student fails to:
- 10 (1) Earn at least [12] NINE credit hours in each academic year in which 11 the student receives assistance through the Program;
- 12 (2) Make satisfactory progress toward fulfilling all degree requirements 13 of the applicable institution of higher education; or
- 14 (3) Complete the employment requirement of this subtitle.
