- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

- 16 (b) There is hereby established in the Department of Public Safety and
- 17 Correctional Services, a Police Training Commission whose membership shall consist
- 18 of the following persons:
- 19 (1) The President of the Maryland Chiefs of Police Association; the
- 20 President of the Maryland Sheriffs Association; the President of the Maryland Law
- 21 Enforcement Officers, Inc.; the Attorney General of the State of Maryland; the
- 22 Secretary of the State Police; the Commissioner, Baltimore City Police Department;
- 23 the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland; the agent in charge of the
- 24 Baltimore office of the F.B.I.; the President of the Eastern Shore Police Association; a
- 25 representative of the Maryland State Lodge of Fraternal Order of Police; the Deputy
- 26 Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services; THE CHAIRMAN OF THE
- 27 MARYLAND MUNICIPAL LEAGUE POLICE EXECUTIVE ASSOCIATION; and three police
- 28 officials of the State to be appointed by the Secretary of Public Safety and
- 29 Correctional Services, with the approval of the Governor, and with the advice and

- 1 consent of the Senate, to represent the State geographically, the appointments to be
- 2 made for a three-year term provided that, for the first term, one official shall be
- 3 appointed for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of
- 4 three years.
- 5 (2) The nonappointive officeholders may elect to serve personally at any
- 6 or all meetings of the Commission or may designate a member of their respective
- 7 association, office, department, university or agency to represent them and to act for
- 8 them at the said meetings to the same effect as if they were personally present.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 10 effect October 1, 2002.
