10 (a) For members who transfer from the Employees' Pension System or the

11 Employees' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the

12 accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System the employer

13 contributions that were made to the Employees' Retirement System and the

14 Employees' Pension System on behalf of those members who transferred, plus the

15 interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.

(b) For those full-time employees of the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue
Department who were employed on or after October 1, 1993 and who elect

31, 2000, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the accumulation fund of the Law

12 (2) Provide that individuals eligible for admission to the system are not 13 eligible for admission to or eligible to receive any benefits from any other pension 14 system, except Social Security benefits, if the other system is financed or funded, 15 whether wholly or partially or directly or indirectly, by funds paid or appropriated by 16 the Administration; and

17 (3) Provide a system of benefits payable to the beneficiaries and 18 dependents of any participant in the system after the death of the participant,

19 whether accidental or not and whether occurring in the performance of duty or not,

20 subject to any exceptions, conditions, restrictions, and classifications that the

21 Administration provides.

[(c)] (D) Unless the Administration determines otherwise, no employee of the
Administration and no beneficiary or dependent of any employee of the
Administration is eligible to receive any pension, retirement, or other benefit both
under the Administration's system and under any other pension or retirement system
established by an acquired transportation system or provided for under any collective
bargaining agreement between the Administration and the authorized
representatives of its employees.

29 [(d)] (E) The pension system shall be financed or funded as the 30 Administration determines economically feasible.
