#### SENATE BILL 284

# 1 (1) For a first offense, to a fine not exceeding \$20,000 OR 2 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH; or

3 (2) For a second or subsequent offense, to a fine not exceeding \$25,000, 4 or imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or both.
