BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 **Article - Public Utility Companies** 14 7-516. In recognition of the potential environmental impacts of 15 16 restructuring the electric industry, it is the intent of the General Assembly to minimize the effects of electric restructuring on the environment. 18 Electric companies in Maryland shall conduct a study that (ii) 19 tracks shifts in generation and emissions as a result of restructuring the electric 20 industry. The study shall be submitted to the Department of the 21 (iii) 22 Environment and the Commission one year after the initial date of implementation of 23 customer choice. (IV) ELECTRIC COMPANIES IN MARYLAND SHALL UPDATE THIS 24 25 STUDY TWICE AND SUBMIT EACH UPDATED STUDY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE

26 ENVIRONMENT AND THE COMMISSION ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2002 AND ON

27 OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2004.

- 1 (2) If, after review of the study required under paragraph (1) of this
- 2 subsection, the Department of the Environment determines that the emissions levels
- 3 impose a higher emission burden in Maryland, the Department of the Environment,
- 4 in consultation with the Commission, shall study the appropriateness,
- 5 constitutionality, and feasibility of establishing an air quality surcharge or other
- 6 mechanism to protect Maryland's environment in connection with the
- 7 implementation of customer choice of electricity suppliers.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 9 effect July 1, 2002.
