- 7 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in
- 8 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious
- 9 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the
- 10 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that
- 11 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for
- 12 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

13 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 14 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any
- 15 other loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan
- 16 enabling act, under the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued,
- 17 for any expenditure authorized by that act; and
- 18 (b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may
- 19 advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation
- 20 bond loan enabling act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the
- 21 Board, for any expenditure authorized by that act, provided that the next ensuing
- 22 sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the
- 23 authority of that act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so
- 24 advanced.
- 25 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the following
- 26 appropriations contained in Section 1(3) of this Act are contingent upon the
- 27 cancellation of appropriations for the same amounts and purposes contained in the
- 28 fiscal year 1999 operating budget (Chapter 109 of the 1998 Laws of Maryland), the
- 29 fiscal year 2000 operating budget (Chapter 118 of the 1999 Laws of Maryland), the
- 30 fiscal year 2001 operating budget (Chapter 204 of the 2000 Laws of Maryland) and,
