Crosswalks - School Crossing Guards - Traffic Regulation

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a school crossing guard to signal, stop, or otherwise

- 4 direct or regulate traffic only within a crosswalk to permit the safe crossing of
- 5 pedestrians in a through the crosswalk; prohibiting a person from willfully
- 6 disobeying a lawful order or direction of a school crossing guard; requiring that
- 7 a certain fine that is collected by the District Court be remitted to a certain
- 8 county or municipal corporation that employs a certain school crossing guard;
- 9 requiring a school crossing guard to be an employee of a county or local law
- 10 enforcement agency; requiring each county or local law enforcement agency to
- 11 establish a training program and appropriate uniform for school crossing
- 12 guards; providing a certain penalty for a violation of this Act; and generally
- 13 relating to the regulation of traffic by school crossing guards.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 (b) (1) If a parking or impounding fine, penalty, or forfeiture, or a fine,

11 penalty, or forfeiture relating to violation of housing, building, fire, health, or

12 <u>sanitation codes, or a Mass Transit Fare Payment Statute, or a fine or penalty</u>

13 relating to failure to pay the prescribed toll at a highway or vehicular crossing is
14 collected by the District Court pursuant to a local ordinance, law, or regulation of a

15 political subdivision or municipality, or pursuant to a regulation of an agency of State

16 government authorized to regulate parking of motor vehicles, or pursuant to a statute

17 pertaining to the payment of mass transit fares, or pursuant to a statute pertaining to

18 the failure to pay tolls, it shall be remitted to the respective local government, or to

19 the State agency.

21 ARTICLE RELATING TO DISOBEYING A LAWFUL ORDER OF A SCHOOL CROSSING

27 (A) <u>WITHIN A CROSSWALK,</u> A SCHOOL CROSSING GUARD MAY SIGNAL, STOP,
28 OR OTHERWISE DIRECT OR REGULATE TRAFFIC TO ALLOW THE SAFE CROSSING OF

1 (D) EACH COUNTY OR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL 2 ESTABLISH:

5 (2) AN APPROPRIATE UNIFORM FOR SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS IN THE 6 COUNTY.

8 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 9 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 10 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2002.
