- 18 (a) In this subtitle, "employer" means a person engaged in a business,
- 19 industry, profession, trade, or other enterprise in the State.
- 20 (b) "Employer" includes:
- 21 (1) a unit of State or local government that employs individuals who are
- 22 not subject to the provisions of Title 9, Subtitle 5 of the State Personnel and Pensions
- 23 Article; and
- 24 (2) a person who acts directly or indirectly in the interest of another
- 25 employer with an employee.

- 2 (a) This subtitle applies to an employer who provides leave with pay to an 3 employee following the birth of the employee's child.
- 4 (b) An employer who provides leave with pay to an employee following the
- 5 birth of the employee's child shall provide the same leave with pay to an employee
- 6 when a child is placed with the employee for adoption.
