- 17 As used in this article, the following words and terms shall have the following 18 meanings unless the context indicates another or different meaning or intent:
- 19 (h) (1) "Hospital" means a hospital, a related institution or a combination of
- 20 a hospital and a related institution, located within this State and either meeting the
- 21 requirements of and having a license or licenses as required by § 19-318 of the Health
- 22 General Article or, in the case of a new institution, having a prelicensing
- 23 certification or recertification from the State Health Planning and Development
- 24 Agency and being or to be, in fact, a health care facility available to the general public

1 maintained and operated as a nonprofit institution by some person, association,

2 municipal or other corporation, or other agency, or a nonprofit corporation organized

5 (2) "Hospital" includes:

6 Nonprofit comprehensive health centers providing out-patient (i) primary health services available to the general public, but does not include any 7 8 facility as described in this item which is owned and operated by the State, except 9 that with the approval of the Board of Public Works and the Joint Audit Committee of 10 the General Assembly the term includes medical or health care facilities of the 11 University System of Maryland; 12 (ii) Nonprofit life care or continuing care communities providing 13 self-contained residence facilities for the retired or elderly, but does not include any 14 facility as described in this item which is owned and operated by the State unless 15 approved by the Board of Public Works and the Joint Audit Committee of the General 16 Assembly;

17 (iii) Any combination of any of the facilities and centers enumerated 18 in items (i) and (ii) of this paragraph; [and]

19 (iv) Any entity affiliated or associated with a hospital, as defined in

20 paragraph (1) of this subsection or item (i), (ii), or (iii) of this paragraph, provided that 21 the Authority determines by resolution that the financing of a project for that entity

22 serves the public purposes of the hospital; AND

(V) A NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLAN THAT HOLDS A
24 CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY AND PROVIDES HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES OR
25 CONTRACTS IN THE STATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE INSURANCE ARTICLE.

26(3)Facilities of the University of Maryland Medical System Corporation27shall not be deemed to be owned and operated by the State.
