

4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	OR the purpose of renaming a certain statewide interagency system of comprehensive early intervention services for certain infants and toddlers to be the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program; providing for the purpose of the Program; requiring the Maryland State Department of Education to distribute funds to counties for the Program according to a certain formula; requiring the State to provide a certain percentage of the funds for the Program subject to a certain condition; requiring the Governor to include a certain amount in certain State budgets for the Program; and generally relating to the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program. 3Y repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Education Section 8-416 Annotated Code of Maryland

18 19 o	WHEREAS, Brain research confirms that the most rapid brain development occurs in the first three years of life; and
20 21 e	WHEREAS, The General Assembly has recognized the immediate need for effective strategies to prepare all children to enter school ready to learn; and
22 23 c	WHEREAS, The National Academy of Sciences concludes that the course of development for young children can be altered by effective early interventions; and

- WHEREAS, A key component of effective early intervention is the Program of Hearing-Impaired Infants; and
- WHEREAS, The Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program provides effective,
- 4 integrated services to young children from birth through age three who demonstrate
- 5 a 25% delay in development, have a diagnosed condition with a high probability of
- 6 delay, or demonstrate atypical development or behavior; and
- WHEREAS, Early intervention services are provided in a child's natural
- 8 environment, such as home, child care settings, and community learning centers; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Early intervention services and strategies are modeled for parents
- 10 and caregivers so that development may continue in the child's daily living routines;
- 11 and
- WHEREAS, An Individualized Family Service Plan is implemented to assist
- 13 with the needs of the family, as well as the young child receiving services; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The number of children and families receiving services from the
- 15 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program has increased 30% since 1995, with the State
- 16 appropriation remaining at \$400,000 since fiscal year 1997; and
- WHEREAS, The current level of available federal, State, and local funds is
- 18 insufficient to provide early intervention services to the steadily increasing number of
- 19 infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families in compliance with Part C of
- 20 the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and COMAR 13A.13.01; and
- 21 WHEREAS, 24% of the young children receiving early intervention through the
- 22 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program in 2000 required no special education
- 23 services at age three; now, therefore,
- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 26 Article Education
- 27 8-416.
- 28 [(a) The Department shall be the lead agency for supervising and monitoring a
- 29 statewide, community-based interagency system of comprehensive early intervention
- 30 services to eligible infants and toddlers, birth through age 2, and their families.]
- 31 (A) (1) THERE IS A MARYLAND INFANTS AND TODDLERS PROGRAM IN THE
- 32 DEPARTMENT.
- 33 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE A STATEWIDE,
- 34 COMMUNITY-BASED INTERAGENCY SYSTEM OF COMPREHENSIVE EARLY
- 35 INTERVENTION SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE INFANTS AND TODDLERS, BIRTH THROUGH
- 36 AGE 2, AND THEIR FAMILIES.

- $1\,$ GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES, AS OF JULY OF THE SECOND FISCAL YEAR
- 2 PRECEDING THE YEAR FOR WHICH THE AMOUNT IS BEING CALCULATED.
- 3 (3) <u>SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, FOR FISCAL YEAR</u>
- 4 2004 AND EACH SUCCEEDING FISCAL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE A
- 5 GRANT TO THE LOCAL LEAD AGENCY FOR THE PROGRAM IN EACH COUNTY IN AN
- 6 AMOUNT AT LEAST EQUAL TO 20% OF THE PRODUCT OF:
- 7 (I) THE ANNUAL PER CHILD COST; AND
- 8 (II) THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN IN THE COUNTY WHO RECEIVED
- 9 SERVICES UNDER THE PROGRAM IN THE SECOND FISCAL YEAR PRECEDING THE
- 10 YEAR FOR WHICH THE AMOUNT IS BEING CALCULATED.
- 11 (4) (I) THE FUNDING FORMULA PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS
- 12 SUBSECTION SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED ONLY TO THE EXTENT THAT FUNDS ARE
- 13 PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE GRANTS UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS
- 14 SUBSECTION.
- 15 (II) PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT REQUIRE
- 16 FUNDS FOR THE GRANTS UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION TO BE
- 17 INCLUDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 18 [(g)] (I) The Department shall adopt regulations necessary to carry out the
- 19 provisions of this section.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 21 General Assembly that the Governor shall include an appropriation in the State
- 22 budget for fiscal year 2003 for the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program of at least
- 23 \$5,200,000. In addition to any funds appropriated in fiscal year 2003 for the
- 24 Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program, the Governor shall include in the State
- 25 budgets for fiscal year 2004 and each fiscal year thereafter for the Maryland Infants
- 26 and Toddlers Program an appropriation that is sufficient to fund the grants required
- 27 under § 8-416 of the Education Article as amended by this Act.
- 28 SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 29 effect July 1, 2002.
