



- 21 Maryland are participating in the Program.
- 22 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 23 General Assembly that the Governor include \$3 million in the State budget in fiscal
- 24 2003 to implement Education Excellence Awards to be made by institutions of higher
- 25 education in the State established under § 18-307(d) of the Education Article.
- 26 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any reference in the
- 27 Annotated Code rendered obsolete by this Act shall be corrected by the publisher of
- 28 the Annotated Code, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
- 29 Department of Legislative Services, with no further action required by the General
- 30 Assembly. The publisher of the Annotated Code shall adequately describe any such
- 31 correction in an editor's note following the section affected.
- 32 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 33 July 1, 2002.
