4 FOR the purpose of continuing the Board of Boiler Rules in accordance with the

6 to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory and

7 regulatory authority of the Board of Boiler Rules; <u>adding a certain member to</u>

10 requiring that an evaluation of the Board of Boiler Rules and the statutes and

13 the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by

14 extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory

4 experience, <u>1 REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE ANTIQUE BOILER INDUSTRY, 1</u>

5 <u>REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE MODEL BOILER INDUSTRY</u>, and 1 consumer member.

6 (c) [The chairman of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor, with the 7 advice of the Secretary, to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the Governor] 8 FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, THE BOARD SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN.

9 (d) Each member of the Board shall be appointed for a term of 4 years to serve

10 until his successor is appointed and qualifies. Of the members first appointed, 2 shall

11 <u>be appointed for a term of 2 years, 2 for a term of 3 years, and 1, the chairman, for a</u>
12 full term of 4 years. The Commissioner of Labor and Industry shall be a member ex

12 full term of 4 years. The Commissioner of Labor and industry shall be a membe

13 officio of the Board but shall have no vote and shall receive no additional

14 <u>compensation for duties performed in connection therewith. Vacancies shall be filled by</u>
 15 <u>appointment for the unexpired term. Members of the Board shall not receive an annual</u>

16 salary but shall receive compensation as provided in the budget from time to time for

17 each day or part thereof necessarily spent in the discharge of their official duties and

18 shall, in addition, be reimbursed for their reasonable travel and other expenses in

19 accordance with Standard State Travel Regulations. The exercise or performance of all

20 powers, authority, duties and functions vested in the Board by this subtitle shall be

21 subject to the power and authority of the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation

22 as set forth in the Business Regulation Article or elsewhere in the laws of this State.
