A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Board of Boiler Rules and State Board of Stationary Engineers - Sunset**
3 **Extension and Program Evaluation**

4 FOR the purpose of continuing the Board of Boiler Rules in accordance with the
5 provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending
6 to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory and
7 regulatory authority of the Board of Boiler Rules; requiring the Board of Boiler
8 Rules to elect its chairman from among its members with the advice and consent
9 of the Secretary; requiring that an evaluation of the Board of Boiler Rules and
10 the statutes and regulations that relate to the Board of Boiler Rules be
11 performed on or before a certain date; establishing the State Board of Stationary
12 Engineers in the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; providing for
13 the composition, appointment, terms, and compensation of the State Board of
14 Stationary Engineers members; establishing certain powers and duties of the
15 State Board of Stationary Engineers; requiring certain persons to be licensed by
16 the State Board of Stationary Engineers as stationary engineers before
17 performing certain work on heating, air-conditioning, and ventilation
18 equipment in the State; establishing certain education and experience
19 requirements for stationary engineers; establishing certain licensing and license
20 renewal requirements for stationary engineers; establishing certain
21 examination requirements for stationary engineers; authorizing the State Board
22 of Stationary Engineers to deny a license to an applicant, refuse to renew a
23 license, reprimand a licensee, suspend or revoke a license, or impose certain
24 penalties under certain circumstances; providing for certain criminal penalties;
25 establishing certain hearing and appeal procedures for stationary engineers;
26 requiring the State Board of Stationary Engineers to adopt certain regulations
27 to provide for the conduct of continuing education courses before renewal of a
28 license; requiring that an evaluation of the State Board of Stationary Engineers
29 and the statutes and regulations that relate to the State Board of Stationary
30 Engineers be performed on or before a certain date; requiring the State Board of
31 Stationary Engineers to submit a certain report to certain committees of the
32 General Assembly on or before a certain date; repealing the sections of the
33 Public Local Laws of Baltimore City regarding examining engineers; defining
34 certain terms; specifying the terms of the initial members of the State Board of

1 Stationary Engineers; providing for a delayed effective date for certain
2 provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the Board of Boiler Rules and the
3 State Board of Stationary Engineers.

31 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
32 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(c) [The chairman of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice of the Secretary, to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the Governor]

The provisions of this subtitle creating the Board of Boiler Rules and relating to the regulation of boilers or pressure vessels and any regulations promulgated under this subtitle are of no effect and may not be enforced after July 1, [2003] 2014.

Article - State Government

8-403.

(a) On or before December 15 of the 2nd year before the evaluation date of a governmental activity or unit, the Legislative Policy Committee, based on a preliminary evaluation, may waive as unnecessary the evaluation required under this section.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (a) of this section, on or before the evaluation date for the following governmental activities or units, an evaluation shall be made of the following governmental activities or units and the statutes and regulations that relate to the governmental activities or units:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(B) "BOARD" MEANS THE STATE BOARD OF STATIONARY ENGINEERS.

1 (C) "LICENSE" MEANS, UNLESS THE CONTEXT REQUIRES OTHERWISE, A
2 LICENSE ISSUED BY THE BOARD TO PERFORM THE FUNCTIONS OF A STATIONARY
3 ENGINEER.

4 (D) "STATIONARY ENGINEER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL THAT STARTS UP,
5 OPERATES, REGULATES, MAINTAINS, AND REPAIRS MACHINERY THAT PROVIDES
6 HEAT, AIR-CONDITIONING, AND VENTILATION IN LARGE BUILDINGS AND
7 COMPLEXES.

9 THE PURPOSES OF THIS TITLE ARE TO SAFEGUARD LIFE, HEALTH, AND
10 PROPERTY AND TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC WELFARE BY REGULATING STATIONARY

14 THERE IS A STATE BOARD OF STATIONARY ENGINEERS IN THE DEPARTMENT.

15 6.5-202.

16 (A) (1) THE BOARD CONSISTS OF SEVEN MEMBERS.

17 (2) OF THE SEVEN MEMBERS OF THE BOARD:

18 (I) THREE SHALL BE STATIONARY ENGINEERS;

19 (II) ONE SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE BOILER
20 MANUFACTURE AND DESIGN INDUSTRY;

21 (III) ONE SHALL BE A BOILER OWNER; AND

22 (IV) TWO SHALL BE CONSUMER MEMBERS.

23 (3) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS WITH THE ADVICE
24 OF THE SECRETARY AND WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

25 (B) EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE:

26 (1) A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES; AND

27 (2) A RESIDENT OF THE STATE.

28 (C) EACH ENGINEER MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL:

29 (1) HAVE AT LEAST 10 YEARS PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE IN RUNNING
30 STEAM ENGINES, BOILERS, AND APPLIANCES PERTAINING TO STATIONARY AND
31 PORTABLE ENGINES; AND

1 (2) HOLD A STATE LICENSE AT ALL TIMES DURING THE MEMBER'S TERM
2 ON THE BOARD.

3 (D) BEFORE TAKING OFFICE, EACH APPOINTEE TO THE BOARD SHALL TAKE
4 THE OATH REQUIRED BY ARTICLE I, § 9 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.

5 (E) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 3 YEARS AND BEGINS ON JULY 1.

6 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE
7 TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON JULY 1, 2003.

8 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A
9 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

10 (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
11 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
12 QUALIFIES.

13 (F) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR INCOMPETENCE,
14 MISCONDUCT, NEGLECT OF DUTIES, OR OTHER SUFFICIENT CAUSE.

16 (A) FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, THE BOARD SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN AND
17 OTHER OFFICERS AS NECESSARY.

18 (B) THE MANNER OF ELECTION AND THE TERMS OF OFFICERS SHALL BE AS
19 THE BOARD DETERMINES.

20 (C) THE CHIEF BOILER INSPECTOR, OR THE CHIEF BOILER INSPECTOR'S
21 DESIGNEE, SHALL BE AN EX OFFICIO NONVOTING MEMBER OF THE BOARD.

23 (A) A MAJORITY OF THE AUTHORIZED MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD IS A
24 QUORUM.

25 (B) (1) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR, AT THE TIMES
26 AND PLACES THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES.

27 (2) THE BOARD MAY HOLD SPECIAL MEETINGS AS PROVIDED IN ITS
28 BYLAWS.

29 (3) NOTICE OF MEETINGS OF THE BOARD SHALL BE GIVEN AS REQUIRED
30 IN ITS BYLAWS.

31 (4) THE BOARD SHALL MEET WITH AND CONSULT THE BOARD OF
32 BOILER RULES AS NECESSARY BUT NOT LESS THAN TWO TIMES EACH YEAR.

33 (C) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD:

1 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT

2 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
3 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

4 (D) THE BOARD MAY EMPLOY A STAFF IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE
5 BUDGET.

6 6.5-205.

7 (A) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT, BY REGULATION, A CODE OF ETHICS THAT
8 SHALL BE THE STANDARD OF CONDUCT REQUIRED BY THE BOARD FOR ALL PERSONS
9 LICENSED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE.

10 (B) THE BOARD SHALL DISTRIBUTE:

11 (1) TO EACH APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE, A COPY OF THE MARYLAND
12 STATIONARY ENGINEERS ACT AND THE BOARD'S RULES AND REGULATIONS; AND

13 (2) ON EACH RENEWAL OF A LICENSE, TO EACH LICENSEE, A COPY OF
14 ANY AMENDMENTS TO THE MARYLAND STATIONARY ENGINEERS ACT AND THE
15 BOARD'S RULES AND REGULATIONS THAT TOOK EFFECT DURING THE 2-YEAR
16 PERIOD ENDING ON THE DATE OF RENEWAL.

18 (A) SUBJECT TO THE STATE BUDGET, THE BOARD MAY EMPLOY AN
19 INVESTIGATIVE STAFF TO:

20 (1) INVESTIGATE A COMPLAINT; AND

21 (2) PERFORM ANY OTHER RELATED DUTY, AS ASSIGNED BY THE BOARD.

22 (B) (1) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A SUBPOENA FOR THE ATTENDANCE OF A
23 WITNESS TO TESTIFY OR THE PRODUCTION OF EVIDENCE IN CONNECTION WITH:

24 (I) ANY DISCIPLINARY ACTION UNDER § 6.5-313 OF THIS TITLE; OR

25 (II) ANY PROCEEDING BROUGHT FOR AN ALLEGED VIOLATION OF
26 THIS TITLE.

27 (2) A SUBPOENA SHALL BE SIGNED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND THE
28 SECRETARY OF THE BOARD AND SEALED.

29 (3) IF A PERSON FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER
30 THIS SUBSECTION, ON PETITION OF THE BOARD, A CIRCUIT COURT MAY COMPEL
31 COMPLIANCE WITH THE SUBPOENA.

32 (C) (1) THE BOARD MAY SUE IN THE NAME OF THE STATE TO ENFORCE ANY
33 PROVISION OF THIS TITLE BY INJUNCTION.

1 (2) IN SEEKING AN INJUNCTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD
2 IS NOT REQUIRED TO:

3 (I) POST BOND; OR

4 (II) ALLEGE OR PROVE EITHER THAT:

5 1. AN ADEQUATE REMEDY AT LAW DOES NOT EXIST; OR

6 2. SUBSTANTIAL OR IRREPARABLE DAMAGE WOULD RESULT
7 FROM THE CONTINUED VIOLATION OF THE PROVISION.

8 (3) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY NOT BE HELD PERSONALLY LIABLE
9 FOR ANY ACTION TAKEN UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IN GOOD FAITH AND WITH
10 REASONABLE GROUNDS.

12 (A) ON REQUEST OF ANY PERSON AND PAYMENT OF A FEE, THE BOARD SHALL
13 CERTIFY THE LICENSING STATUS AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
14 THE SUBJECT OF THE REQUEST.

15 (B) EACH CERTIFICATION UNDER THIS SECTION:

16 (1) SHALL INCLUDE A STATEMENT OF THE LICENSING STATUS OF THE
17 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REQUEST; AND

18 (2) MAY INCLUDE:

19 (I) INFORMATION ABOUT THE EXAMINATION RESULTS AND
20 OTHER QUALIFICATIONS OF THAT INDIVIDUAL;

21 (II) INFORMATION ABOUT THE DATES OF ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL
22 OF THE LICENSE OF THAT INDIVIDUAL;

23 (III) INFORMATION ABOUT ANY DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN
24 AGAINST THAT INDIVIDUAL; AND

25 (IV) IF AUTHORIZED BY THAT INDIVIDUAL, INFORMATION ABOUT
26 ANY COMPLAINT AGAINST THAT INDIVIDUAL.

27 (C) THE BOARD SHALL COLLECT A FEE OF \$10 FOR EACH CERTIFICATION
28 UNDER THIS SECTION.

30 (A) IN ADDITION TO ANY POWERS SET FORTH ELSEWHERE, THE BOARD MAY
31 ADOPT:

32 (1) ANY BYLAW FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE

1 (2) ANY RULE OR REGULATION TO CARRY OUT THIS TITLE, SUBJECT TO
2 THE LIMITATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

16 (A) IN ADDITION TO THE OTHER QUALIFICATIONS FOR A LICENSE SET FORTH

18 MEETING THE EDUCATIONAL AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN
19 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

20 (B) (1) AN APPLICANT FOR THE FIRST GRADE STATIONARY ENGINEER'S
21 EXAMINATION QUALIFIES UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE APPLICANT POSSESSES AT
22 LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATIONS:

23 (I) A SECOND GRADE STATIONARY ENGINEER LICENSE FOR 1 YEAR
24 OR MORE AND EMPLOYMENT FOR AT LEAST 12 MONTHS (1,750 WORKING HOURS) IN
25 THE OPERATION OF HIGH PRESSURE BOILERS;

26 (II) 5 YEARS OR MORE OPERATING EXPERIENCE IN A PLANT THAT
27 GENERATES A MINIMUM OF 17,250 POUNDS OF STEAM PER HOUR;

28 (III) A DEGREE IN MECHANICAL ENGINEERING FROM AN
29 ACCREDITED UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE, AND 6 MONTHS OR MORE OF PRACTICAL
30 EXPERIENCE; OR

31 (IV) A VALID MARINE ENGINEER'S CERTIFICATE OR A CHIEF PETTY
32 OFFICER'S CERTIFICATE FROM THE UNITED STATES NAVY, WITH STEAM BOILER
33 ENGINEER TRAINING.

1 (2) AN APPLICANT FOR A SECOND GRADE STATIONARY ENGINEER'S
2 EXAMINATION QUALIFIES UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE APPLICANT POSSESSES AT
3 LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATIONS:

4 (I) EMPLOYMENT FOR AT LEAST 24 MONTHS (3,500 WORKING
5 HOURS) IN A POWER PLANT UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED FIRST
6 GRADE STATIONARY ENGINEER;

7 (II) EMPLOYMENT AS A THIRD GRADE STATIONARY ENGINEER FOR
8 1 YEAR OR MORE; OR

9 (III) A VALID MARINE ENGINEER'S CERTIFICATE OR CHIEF PETTY
10 OFFICER'S CERTIFICATE FROM THE UNITED STATES NAVY.

11 (3) AN APPLICANT FOR A THIRD OR FOURTH GRADE STATIONARY
12 ENGINEER'S EXAMINATION QUALIFIES UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE APPLICANT
13 SHOWS EXPERIENCE IN THE OPERATION OF OR EXPERIENCE AROUND A PLANT OR
14 MACHINERY.

15 (C) AN APPLICANT FOR ANY EXAMINATION MAY SUBSTITUTE 2 YEARS OF
16 EDUCATION IN A TRADE OR VOCATIONAL SCHOOL FOR 1 YEAR OF PRACTICAL
17 EXPERIENCE.

19 (A) AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE SHALL:

20 (1) SUBMIT TO THE BOARD:

21 (I) AN APPLICATION ON THE FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES;
22 AND

23 (II) ANY RELEVANT DOCUMENT THAT THE BOARD REQUIRES; AND

24 (2) PAY TO THE BOARD OR THE BOARD'S DESIGNEE AN EXAMINATION
25 FEE SET BY THE BOARD IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THE COST OF THE
26 REQUIRED EXAMINATIONS.

27 (B) AN APPLICATION SHALL BE MADE UNDER OATH.

28 (C) IF THE BOARD FINDS THAT AN APPLICATION FORM AND THE
29 ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTATION DO NOT DEMONSTRATE THAT THE APPLICANT
30 MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE BOARD
31 MAY REQUIRE THE APPLICANT TO SUBMIT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION OR
32 DOCUMENTATION.

34 (A) THE BOARD SHALL EXAMINE ALL ENGINEERS WHO ARE 18 YEARS OLD OR
35 OLDER AND WHO APPLY AND QUALIFY FOR EXAMINATION.

1 (B) THE BOARD PERIODICALLY SHALL GIVE THE EXAMINATIONS REQUIRED
2 UNDER THIS SUBTITLE TO QUALIFIED APPLICANTS AT THE TIMES AND PLACES THAT
3 THE BOARD DETERMINES.

4 (C) THE BOARD SHALL GIVE EACH QUALIFIED APPLICANT NOTICE OF THE
5 TIME AND PLACE OF EXAMINATION.

6 (D) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE SUBJECTS, SCOPE, AND FORM OF AND

5 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in
6 Section 11 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
