8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

# Article - State Government

18 8-403.

(a) On or before December 15 of the 2nd year before the evaluation date of a
governmental activity or unit, the Legislative Policy Committee, based on a
preliminary evaluation, may waive as unnecessary the evaluation required under this
section.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (a) of this section, on or before
the evaluation date for the following governmental activities or units, an evaluation
shall be made of the following governmental activities or units and the statutes and

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of

### **SENATE BILL 458**

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of

2 Examiners of Psychologists shall submit a final financial plan to the Senate

3 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House

4 Environmental Matters Committee on or before March 1, 2003, in accordance with §

5 2-1246 of the State Government Article. The final financial plan shall:

6 (1) assess options for bringing expenditures in line with revenues, 7 including reducing expenditures;

8 (2) identify the need for any future fee increases, including determining 9 what appropriate increases would be relative to the fees charged by other boards;

10 (3) discuss how the Board can maintain an appropriate fund balance; 11 and

12 (4) institute a systematic, ongoing process for long-term financial 13 planning.

14 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 July 1, 2002.

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
