A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Police Retirement System - Retirees - Reemployment as Sheriffs or**
3 **State's Attorneys**

4 FOR the purpose of exempting certain members of the State Police Retirement
5 System from a prohibition that members of the State Police Retirement System
6 cannot accept a retirement or pension allowance from another pension or
7 retirement system supported wholly or in part by the State; providing for the
8 application of this Act; and generally relating to an additional retirement or
9 pension allowance for members of the State Police Retirement System.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
11 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

18 24-406.

19 (a) A member may be entitled to benefits under Title 29 of this article other
20 than, or in addition to, the service retirement benefits provided under this subtitle.

21 (b) (1) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS:

22 (I) RECEIVING A SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OR A VESTED
23 ALLOWANCE FROM THE STATE POLICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AND

24 (II) SERVING AS A SHERIFF OR STATE'S ATTORNEY FOR A COUNTY
25 THAT IS A PARTICIPATING GOVERNMENTAL UNIT.

26 (2) A member is not entitled to receive a pension or retirement allowance
27 from another pension or retirement system supported wholly or in part by the State.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
2 construed retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect any
3 individual who was serving as a sheriff or State's Attorney on or after January 4, 1999
4 and is serving in that same position on July 1, 2002.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
6 July 1, 2002.
