- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 1 **Article - Transportation** 2 24-102. 3 (c) A vehicle may not be driven on any highway if the width of the (1) vehicle exceeds the limits specified in this subsection, unless: 5 It has a permit issued by the State Highway Administration (i) 6 under § 24-112 of this subtitle; or 7 As to a highway under the jurisdiction of a local authority, it has (ii) special permission from the local authority. (2) For a motor vehicle loaded with tobacco hogsheads or sod, the width 10 limit is 102 inches. 11 For a bus[, motor home, or travel trailer] on any highway that is 12 part of the interstate system or State primary system or for a publicly owned transit 13 bus, the width limit is 102 inches. 14 FOR A MOTOR HOME OR TRAVEL TRAILER ON ANY HIGHWAY THAT IS 15 PART OF THE INTERSTATES SYSTEM OR STATE PRIMARY SYSTEM, THE WIDTH LIMIT 16 IS 102 INCHES EXCLUDING SAFETY DEVICES, RETRACTED AWNINGS, AND OTHER APPURTENANCES INSTALLED BY THE MANUFACTURER. 18 (5) For a truck or combination of vehicles, the width limit is 102 inches, 19 provided that: 20 It is being operated on any part of the interstate system or other 21 State system highways that are designated by the Secretary in conjunction with the 22 U.S. Department of Transportation; or 23 (ii) It is being operated on a highway that: 24 Is the shortest practical route between a designated 25 highway and a truck terminal, a point of origin/destination for cargo, or for a distance 26 not to exceed 1 mile, facilities for food, fuel, repairs, or rest; or 27 2. Is the safest practical route and is a State highway with 4 28 or more lanes. For any other vehicle, the width limit is 96 inches. 29 [(5)](6) 30 24-104.1. 31 Except as otherwise provided in this section, a [bus,] BUS OR a single unit [truck, or a Class M motor home] TRUCK may not be over 40 feet long. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a publicly owned rigid (1) 34 bus may not be over 41 feet long.

20 (2) For each permit issued under this subsection, the State Highway 21 Administration shall charge a fee of not less than \$30.	
22 (b) (1) THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION MAY ISSUE A PERMIT 23 ALLOWING AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF OVERSIZED CAMPING TRAILERS, MOTOR 24 HOMES, OR TRAVEL TRAILERS TO USE THE HIGHWAYS IN THIS STATE FOR 25 COMMERCIAL PURPOSES.

30 (III) MAY NOT IMPOSE ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS ON THE 31 MOVEMENT OF THE CAMPING TRAILERS, MOTOR HOMES, OR TRAVEL TRAILERS.	
32 (3) FOR EACH PERMIT ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE STATE 33 HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION SHALL CHARGE A FEE OF NOT LESS THAN \$30.
