1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Mental Hygiene - Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response System**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response  
4 System in the Mental Hygiene Administration; requiring the crisis response  
5 system to use and coordinate certain services to develop an effective crisis  
6 response system to serve all individuals in the State; requiring the crisis  
7 response system to provide certain clinical interventions; requiring the crisis  
8 response system to respond quickly and effectively to community crisis  
9 situations; requiring the Mental Hygiene Administration to consult with certain  
10 entities in the development of the crisis response system; requiring the crisis  
11 response system to include crisis communication centers, emergency services,  
12 follow-up services, community awareness promotion and training programs,  
13 and a certain evaluation of outcomes of services; requiring services to be  
14 implemented as determined by certain core service agencies; providing that  
15 advance directives for mental health services apply to the delivery of services  
16 under this Act; ~~providing for the funding of this Act requiring the~~  
17 Administration to implement the Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response  
18 System in a certain manner; requiring the crisis response system to contract  
19 with certain service providers; making this Act subject to a certain contingency;  
20 and generally relating to the Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response System.

6 Preamble

7 WHEREAS, There has been a significant increase in the need for community  
8 public mental health services and the lack of these services, including comprehensive  
9 crisis intervention services and supports, has resulted in an overutilization of costly  
10 acute care State hospital beds; and

11 WHEREAS, The Mental Hygiene Administration recommends the  
12 establishment of an initiative to identify and provide enhanced community-based  
13 services for individuals who are at high risk for repeated hospitalizations,  
14 homelessness, criminal arrest, or suicide; and

15 WHEREAS, In the recent report to the Governor by the Community Access  
16 Steering Committee, the Committee concluded that one of the major barriers to  
17 expanding community access to mental health treatment is the lack of a  
18 comprehensive, statewide mental health crisis intervention system as an alternative  
19 to hospitalization; and

20 WHEREAS, The recent terrorism attacks, including those of September 11,  
21 2001, have resulted in increased anxiety and other mental disorders among citizens  
22 throughout the United States, particularly among those who have had previous  
23 experiences with trauma, and increased concern about the possibility of future  
24 terrorist attacks, warranting the establishment of a comprehensive statewide mental  
25 health crisis response system; now, therefore,

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS

7 (C) "CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM" MEANS THE MARYLAND MENTAL HEALTH

10 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM IN  
11 THE MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION.

12 (B) THE CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM SHALL:

13 (1) OPERATE A STATEWIDE NETWORK UTILIZING EXISTING RESOURCES  
14 AND COORDINATING INTERJURISDICTIONAL SERVICES TO DEVELOP EFFICIENT AND  
15 EFFECTIVE CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEMS TO SERVE ALL INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE,  
16 24 HOURS A DAY AND 7 DAYS A WEEK;

17 (2) PROVIDE SKILLED CLINICAL INTERVENTION TO HELP PREVENT  
18 SUICIDES, HOMICIDES, UNNECESSARY HOSPITALIZATIONS, AND ARRESTS OR  
19 DETENTION, AND TO REDUCE DANGEROUS OR THREATENING SITUATIONS  
20 INVOLVING INDIVIDUALS IN NEED OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES; AND

21 (3) RESPOND QUICKLY AND EFFECTIVELY TO COMMUNITY CRISIS  
22 SITUATIONS.

23 (C) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL CONSULT WITH CONSUMERS OF MENTAL  
24 HEALTH SERVICES, FAMILY MEMBERS, AND MENTAL HEALTH ADVOCATES IN THE  
25 DEVELOPMENT OF THE CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM.

7 (C) AN ADVANCE DIRECTIVE FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES UNDER § 5-602.1  
8 OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL APPLY TO THE DELIVERY OF SERVICES UNDER THIS  
9 SUBTITLE.

10 (D) THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO AFFECT PETITIONS FOR  
11 EMERGENCY EVALUATIONS UNDER § 10-622 OF THIS TITLE.

13 ~~(A) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE STATE BUDGET SUFFICIENT~~

21 JURISDICTIONAL BASIS AS FEDERAL FUNDING OR FUNDING FROM OTHER SOURCES

24 THE CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM PROVIDERS SHALL CONTRACT WITH SERVICE  
25 PROVIDERS WHO EMPLOY INDIVIDUALS WHO USE OR HAVE USED MENTAL HEALTH  
26 SERVICES.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act is  
28 contingent on the receipt of federal funding or funding from any other private or  
29 public source to implement the Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response System  
30 established under Section 1 of this Act. The Mental Hygiene Administration, within  
31 15 days after the receipt of federal funding or other sources of funding for the  
32 Maryland Mental Health Crisis Response System, shall give written notice to the  
33 Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland, of the  
34 receipt of funding. Section 1 of this Act shall take effect 5 days after the date of the  
35 written notice from the Administration.

36 SECTION 2-3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 2  
37 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2002.
