- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) The Secretary shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to prevent:
- 17 (1) The introduction of an infectious or contagious disease into this
- 18 State; or
- 19 (2) The spread of an infectious or contagious disease in this State.
- 20 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an individual
- 21 enrolled in an institution of higher education who resides in on-campus student
- 22 housing shall be vaccinated against BOTH meningococcal disease AND HEPATITIS B
- 23 VIRUS.
- 24 (2) An individual is exempt from the vaccination [requirement]
- 25 REQUIREMENTS in paragraph (1) of this subsection if:
