A person may not hunt or attempt to hunt nongame birds and 7 mammals in Baltimore County or Frederick County without first obtaining a license. 8 A permanent resident of a government reservation may obtain a resident hunter's 9 license. 10 (b) The following persons are not required to obtain a hunter's license OR (1) 11 BONUS ANTLERED DEER STAMP: 12 (i) With respect to hunting on farmland only: 13 1. Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the 14 owner of the farmland and the owner's spouse, children, and children's spouse; and 15 A tenant and the tenant's spouse, children, and, if residing 16 on the farmland, children's spouse. A tenant is a person holding land under a lease, or 17 a sharecropper who resides in a dwelling on the land, but a tenant does not include 18 any employee of the owner or tenant; 19 (ii) Any resident serving in the armed forces of the United States 20 while on leave in the State, during the resident's leave period, if, while hunting, the 21 resident possesses a copy of the resident's official leave order; and 22 (iii) Any unarmed person participating in an organized foxhunt. 23 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1)(i)1 of this subsection do not apply to 24 a nonresident owner of farmland. 25 A person may apply for a hunter's license to any person designated by the (c) 26 Department. The application shall be on a form the Department prepares and supplies. The applicant shall fill out, sign, and submit the application to the person designated to issue the hunter's license. A person may apply by mail. 29 (d) The application shall contain the applicant's name, height, color of eyes 30 and hair, occupation, place of residence, and Social Security number. If the applicant 31 is a nonresident, the applicant also shall present the applicant's driver's license, 32 voter's card, or resident hunter's license.
- Before a hunting license may be issued the applicant for the license shall 33 34 sign a statement which says:
- "I understand that this hunting license does not of itself permit me to hunt on 36 private property, and if I do so without permission of the owner, I may be subject to a 37 fine."



- 1 (3) (i)(1) The Department may issue a limited number of bonus 2 antlerless deer stamps for the purpose of regulating the harvest of antlerless deer in 3 a particular deer management region or zone. 4 [(ii)] The fee to apply for a bonus antlerless deer stamp is \$5 for 5 residents and \$25 for nonresidents. 6 [(iii)] The fee is nonrefundable if the applicant does not obtain (3) 7 an antlerless deer stamp. If an individual obtains a bonus antlerless deer stamp, the 8 application fee for the stamp will be applied to the fee for the stamp and no additional stamp fee will be required. 1 10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 11 it is the intent of the General Assembly that, in accordance with §§ 10-209 12 and 10-308.1 of the Natural Resources Article, the Department of Natural Resources 13 utilize special fund revenue generated as a result of the licensing fee increases under 14 this Act, as appropriate, in order to open to public hunting at least half the total 15 acreage that is leased for hunting to private individuals on the properties known as the 16 Chesapeake Forest Lands by the 2005-2006 hunting season; and 17 the Department shall include in its annual report to the General Assembly 18 a progress report on the public hunting opportunities provided under paragraph (1) of 19 *this section*.
- 20 SECTION 3. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 21 effect August 1, 2002.
