A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Allegany County - Director of Emergency Management

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that the director of emergency management in Allegany
- 4 County shall be an employee of Allegany County and not appointed by the
- 5 Governor; and generally relating to the organization of local emergency
- 6 management in Allegany County.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 8 Article 16A Maryland Emergency Management Agency

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article 16A - Maryland Emergency Management Agency

- 16 (a) (1) Each political subdivision of this State shall establish a local
- 17 organization for emergency management in accordance with the State emergency
- 18 management plan and program and shall participate in federal programs for
- 19 emergency management. [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS
- 20 SECTION, EACH local organization for emergency management shall have a director of
- 21 emergency management who shall be appointed by the Governor, upon the
- 22 recommendation of the mayor, the executive, or governing body of the respective
- 23 political subdivision. Each director of a local organization shall have direct
- 24 responsibility for the organization, administration and operation of the respective
- 25 local organization for emergency management. Each local director shall be subject to
- 26 the direction and control of the mayor, executive, or governing body of the respective
- 27 subdivision, under general power of the Governor. The local organization shall include
- 28 such positions and programs as may be recommended from time to time by the
- 29 Maryland Emergency Management Agency to meet federal and State standards,
- 30 subject to the budgets of the local jurisdictions.

SENATE BILL 604

- 1 (2) Each local organization whose jurisdiction falls within the plume or 2 ingestion zone of a commercial nuclear reactor or which might be reasonably expected
- 3 to host evacuees from another jurisdiction within a plume or ingestion zone shall
- 4 submit to the State Director a radiological emergency response plan. The emergency
- 5 response plan for a jurisdiction within a plume zone shall provide for evacuation of
- 6 the residents of the political subdivision as a result of an emergency or major disaster
- 7 caused by a dangerous release of radiation.
- 8 (b) In any county, or Baltimore City, in which there is a local merit system or
- 9 classified service for the general employees of that political subdivision, the
- 10 employees and officers of the local organization for emergency management (except
- 11 the director) shall be included in and subject to all rights, duties, privileges, and
- 12 responsibilities of that system or service.
- 13 (c) (1) If the county or Baltimore City does not have such a local merit
- 14 system or classified service, the county commissioners or county council, or the board
- 15 of estimates of Baltimore City, may include by regulation the employees and officers
- 16 of the local organization for emergency management (except the director) in the
- 17 classified service of the State Personnel Management System.
- 18 (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, during the effective period of
- 19 any such regulation, the said employees and officers shall be subject to the rights,
- 20 duties, privileges, and responsibilities of the provisions of Division I of the State
- 21 Personnel and Pensions Article, with the particular board of county commissioners or
- 22 county council, or the Mayor of Baltimore City, as the appointing officer thereunder.
- 23 (3) The provisions of this subsection may not be construed or applied to
- 24 remove from the particular board of county commissioners or county council or from
- 25 the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore power to establish and regulate the
- 26 compensation, vacation allowance, and sick leave of all such employees and officers in
- 27 the respective political subdivisions.
- 28 (D) IN ALLEGANY COUNTY, THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT
- 29 SHALL BE HIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERSONNEL POLICY AND PROCEDURES
- 30 OF THE COUNTY AND SHALL BE AN EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 32 October 1, 2002.
