SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
General Assembly that if the Governor does not include in the State budget for fiscal
year 2003 an appropriation for the Baltimore City public schools in an amount
sufficient to fund the recommendations in the 2002 Final Report of the Commission
on Education Finance, Equity, and Excellence as applicable to Baltimore City, then
the Governor shall include in the State budget for fiscal year 2003, if funds are
<u>available</u>, an appropriation for the Baltimore City public schools of at least
\$50,000,000 for the Baltimore City-State Partnership, as provided in Section 7 of
Chapter 105 of the Acts of 1997, as amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of 2001, and
\$55,000,000 toward the Remedy Plan of the Baltimore City Public School System,
including \$20,465,079 as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 493 of the Acts of 2000, as

16 amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of 2001.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the Governor does not
include in the State budget for fiscal years 2004 through 2007 an appropriation for
the Baltimore City Public Schools in an amount sufficient to fund the
recommendations in the 2002 Final Report of the Commission on Education Finance,
Equity, and Excellence as applicable to Baltimore City, then the Governor shall
include in the State budget for fiscal years 2004 through 2007, in each year <u>if funds</u>
are available, an appropriation for the Baltimore City Public Schools of at least

24 \$50,000,000 for the Baltimore City-State Partnership and \$55,000,000 toward the

25 Remedy Plan of the Baltimore City Public School System.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the Governor does not include in the State budget for fiscal years 2003 through 2007 an appropriation for the Baltimore City public schools in an amount sufficient to fund the recommendations in the 2002 Final Report of the Commission on Education Finance, Equity, and Excellence as applicable to Baltimore City, then if any new source of revenue becomes available to the State during fiscal years 2003 through 2007, and such revenue is dedicated in whole or in part to education generally, the Baltimore City public schools shall receive its designated share of those revenues without reduction of the additional funds provided under Sections 3 and 4 Sections 2 and 3 of this Act. Nothing in this Act, however, shall prevent the Governor or the General Assembly from reducing local aid to Baltimore City as part of any general statewide reduction in local aid for a special project or purpose.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December
1, 2006, a consultant shall conduct a comprehensive review and evaluation of the
Baltimore City-State Partnership and the reform initiatives of the Baltimore City
Public School System. The Board of School Commissioners and the Maryland State
Board of Education shall jointly select and equally share the cost of the consultant
and determine the scope of the review. The Board of School Commissioners and the

1 State Board shall review the findings of the comprehensive review and shall conduct

2 four public hearings throughout Baltimore City. On or before January 15, 2007, the

3 Board of School Commissioners and the State Board shall report to the General

4 Assembly the results of the public hearings and the review of the comprehensive

 $5\;$ evaluation and propose to the General Assembly any changes appropriate in the

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the 8 General Assembly that the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Academic Officer, Chief 9 Operating Officer, and the Special Education Officer for the Baltimore City Public 10 School System, with the State Superintendent of Schools and the Assistant State 11 Superintendent for Special Education, shall meet at a minimum on a quarterly basis 12 with the Special Master assigned to the case, Vaughn G., et al v. Mayor and City 13 Council, et al, case no. MJG-84-1911, United States District Court for the District of 14 Maryland. After conducting six quarterly meetings, the State Superintendent and the 15 Chief Executive Officer shall have the discretion, acting jointly, to modify the 16 communication schedule upon providing the basis for any modification to the General 17 Assembly.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Department of Education, the Interagency Committee on Public School Construction, and the Baltimore City Public School System shall develop a mechanism for communication at a minimum on a quarterly basis among key executive level representatives of each entity to address issues relating to facilities planning in the Baltimore City Public School System, including the capital improvement program issues. After a minimum of six quarterly meetings, the State Superintendent shall have the discretion to modify the communication arrangement upon providing the basis for any modification to the General Assembly.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before June 30,
2003, Baltimore City shall bear the costs and complete the transfer of clear and
merchantable title of any real property assets associated with the operations of the
Baltimore City Public School System to the legal possession of the Board of School
Commissioners. By June 30, 2002, the Baltimore City Public School System shall
submit to the State Department of Education for its approval a written plan to
accomplish the required property transfer by June 30, 2003.

34 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before June 30,

10 1997, the Board of Public Works, for the period from July 1, 1991 through June 30,

11 2009, may approve State funding for capital improvements to public school buildings

12 in Baltimore City on property held under a clear deed and title by either the

13 Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners of the Mayor and City Council of

14 Baltimore. However, State funds for the construction of new schools in Baltimore City

15 may only be approved on sites with clear deed and title held by the Baltimore City

16 Board of School Commissioners.

17 SECTION 9. 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Baltimore City shall

18 continue to work with the Baltimore City Public School System to eliminate

19 environmental hazards within the school system and develop a memorandum of

20 understanding to provide funding for the elimination of these environmental hazards

21 after the transfer of title of real property assets to the Baltimore City Public School 22 System.

SECTION 10: 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of
 the General Assembly that this Act constitutes further action by the General
 Assembly regarding consideration of the provisions of § 3-108.1 of the Education
 Article for the purpose of meeting the requirements of Section 28 of Chapter 105 of
