16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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20 (s) A prosecution for an offense under § 14-601 of the Health Occupations

21 Article of practicing, attempting to practice, or offering to practice medicine without a

22 license shall be instituted within 3 years after the offense was committed.

(Y) A PROSECUTION FOR A MISDEMEANOR OFFENSE UNDER TITLE 9 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE SHALL BE INSTITUTED WITHIN 3 YEARS AFTER THE OFFENSE WAS COMMITTED.

18 Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators shall report to the Senate

19 Finance Committee and the House Environmental Matters Committee on or before

20 October 1, 2002, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the

21 implementation of the recommendations of the Department of Legislative Services

22 contained in the sunset evaluation report dated October 2001.

23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland State

24 Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators shall report to the Senate

25 Finance Committee and the House Environmental Matters Committee on or before

26 October 1, 2003, on recommendations of the Board for the Administrator-in-Training

27 program. The report should include an evaluation of: (1) the appropriate length of

28 time for an Administrator-in-Training program; (2) giving more credit for related

29 experience or appropriate education; (3) whether an Administrator-in-Training can 30 train in a facility with 75 beds or less; and (4) how an Administrator-in-Training

31 program can incorporate more quality of care training.

32 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

33 July 1, 2002.
