- 7 approval before awarding a contract in response to an unsolicited proposal;
- 8 requiring a procurement officer to protect the confidentiality of information

- unsolicited proposal; <u>limiting the annual State expenditures under a contract</u>

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before September 30 of each year the Department of Budget and Management shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Commerce and Government Matters Committee, on the impact of this Act, including for the previous fiscal year:

- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply only 4 to an unsolicited proposal offered on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of
- 7 September 30, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 8 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
