1 AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - Student Financial Assistance - Maryland Teacher Scholarship

4 FOR the purpose of expanding the eligibility and renewability requirements for the

5 Maryland Teacher Scholarship to certain part-time students who are pursuing

6 an undergraduate degree in teaching; *making certain teaching assistants*

7 eligible for the Maryland Teacher Scholarship program; specifying the amount

8 for a certain scholarship award; and generally relating to the Maryland Teacher

9 Scholarship program.

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 <u>18-2201.</u>

9 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

10 (b) "Eligible institution" means a public or private institution of higher

11 <u>education in this State that possesses a certificate of approval from the Maryland</u>
 12 <u>Higher Education Commission.</u>

13(c)(1)"Service obligation" means to teach full time in the State as a teacher14in a Maryland public elementary or secondary school.

15 (2) "Service obligation" does not mean employment as teaching assistants,
 16 volunteer service, paid fellowships, or internships.

17 (d) <u>"Administration" means the State Scholarship Administration as defined</u>
 18 <u>in § 18-101(b) of this title.</u>

20 There is a program of Maryland teacher scholarships that are awarded under

21 this subtitle for students who pledge to work as public elementary and secondary

22 <u>school teachers in this State upon completion of their studies.</u>

(a) The Administration shall annually select eligible students and offer a
scholarship to each student selected to be used at an eligible institution of their
choice.

27 (b) <u>(1)</u> A-<u>SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A</u> recipient of 28 the Maryland Teacher Scholarship shall:

1 (3)For a student currently enrolled in high school, have (i) (III)<u>1.</u> 2 earned a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent 3 in core curriculum courses at the time of application; or 4 For a student currently enrolled as a full-time (ii) <u>2.</u> 5 undergraduate student, have maintained a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and have been making satisfactory progress toward a degree in an academic 6 discipline leading to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate; 7 8 Sign a letter of intent to perform the service obligation upon (4)(IV)9 completion of the recipient's required studies; 10 (5)(V)Accept any other conditions attached to the award; and 11 (6) (VI)Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish. 12 (2)NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN 13 INDIVIDUAL WHO, AT THE TIME THE INDIVIDUAL IS SCHEDULED TO MATRICULATE AT AN ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION, WILL HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AS A TEACHING 14 15 ASSISTANT AT A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THE STATE FOR 16 AT LEAST 2 YEARS: 17 (I)MAY APPLY FOR A MARYLAND TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP UNDER THIS SUBTITLE; AND 18 19 IS ELIGIBLE TO HOLD A MARYLAND TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP AS (II)20 A FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE STUDENT. 21 A recipient of the Maryland Teacher Scholarship may not hold a Maryland (c) professional teacher's certificate. 22 23 (d) Applicants who are secondary school students shall provide a high (1)school transcript after completion of the first semester of their senior year. 24 25 Applicants who are currently enrolled in an eligible institution shall (2)26 provide the most recent college transcript, or if not applicable, the applicant may submit a final high school transcript. 27 Applicants who are not currently enrolled in an eligible institution, 28 (3)29 but who are high school graduates shall provide a final high school transcript. Applicants who are high school graduates and are not currently 30 (4)31 enrolled in an eligible institution, but have completed some courses at an eligible

32 institution, shall provide the most recent college transcript.

33 (5) Applicants who are not currently enrolled in an eligible institution,34 but who are college graduates shall provide a final college transcript.

8 (b) (1) Each recipient of a Maryland teacher scholarship who is enrolled in 9 an associate degree program as permitted in this subtitle may renew the award two 10 times if the recipient is enrolled in an associate degree program that, as determined 11 by the institution, requires 3 years to complete.

12 (2) Each recipient of the Maryland teacher scholarship may renew the 13 annual award four times if the recipient is enrolled in a course of study that, as 14 determined by the institution, requires 5 years to complete.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 July 1, 2002.
