2 Education - Adult Education and Literacy Services				
FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland State Department of Education to distribute certain grants for adult education, based on certain factors, and in accordance with a certain plan; requiring the Governor to include certain appropriations in the State budget for adult education and literacy services providing that funding for certain competitive grants for adult education and literacy services shall be as provided in the State Budget; requiring the Department to create a method for funding certain adult education services; requiring the Department to submit a report of its methodology to the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly by a certain date; and generally relating to funding for adult education and literacy services.  BY adding to Article - Education Section 5-217 Annotated Code of Maryland (2001 Replacement Volume)

WHEREAS, It is estimated that at least 613,640 Maryland adults lack a high school diploma; and				
WHEREAS, According to the National Adult Literacy Survey, over 20% of Maryland adults function at the lowest literacy level; and				

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- WHEREAS, Approximately 10% of Maryland residents are foreign born and most need to learn English language skills; and
- WHEREAS, Only 42% of the incarcerated adults in Maryland who lack a high
- 4 school diploma can be accommodated in State-mandated adult education programs;
- 5 and
- WHEREAS, Maryland currently serves only 3% to 4% of the estimated 729,640 adults with literacy needs; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Maryland invests \$45 per student for adult education, an amount
- 9 equivalent to the cost of a GED textbook; and
- WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2002 Maryland appropriated less funding for adult
- 11 education than it did in fiscal year 1990; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The State appropriation for adult education is less than half the
- 13 amount that is needed to generate the \$75 federal match that is available for every
- 14 \$25 of State funding; and
- WHEREAS, It is estimated that adult education has a 17% to 34% rate of return
- 16 on investment in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, Dropouts who get a diploma can generate an estimated \$7,000 in
- 18 additional annual income; and
- WHEREAS, The literacy level of the parent is the best predictor of the literacy
- 20 achievement of the child; and
- 21 WHEREAS, A Task Force to Study Adult Education appointed by the Governor
- 22 and the General Assembly in 2001 studied adult education services, outcomes,
- 23 workforce connection, and funding; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The Task Force to Study Adult Education recommended a
- 25 substantial increase in the State investment for adult education services and that
- 26 State appropriations be needs based; now, therefore,
