BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Criminal Law 2 2-210. 3 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT" MEANS A PLACE IN 4 WHICH: 5 (I) AT LEAST ONE PERSON IS EMPLOYED; AND 6 (II) THE OCCUPANT REGULARLY ENGAGES IN ACTIVITIES RELATED

- 7 TO COMMERCE, INDUSTRY, OR TRADE.
- 8 (2) "BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT" INCLUDES A BUILDING OR STRUCTURE 9 USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF 10 THIS SUBSECTION.
- 11 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO AN OWNER, LESSOR, OR SUPERVISORY 12 EMPLOYEE OF A BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT.
- 13 (C) SOLELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CIVIL LIABILITY, A PERSON WHO USES
 14 DEADLY FORCE OR FORCE LIKELY TO CAUSE DEATH IN THE PERSON'S BUSINESS
 15 ESTABLISHMENT IS PRESUMED TO HAVE HELD A REASONABLE FEAR OF IMMINENT
 16 PERIL OF DEATH OR SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY TO THE PERSON OR AN EMPLOYEE
 17 OF THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT, IF THE FORCE IS USED AGAINST
 18 ANOTHER WHO ENTERS OR HAS ENTERED THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT
- 20 (D) A PERSON DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IS NOT 21 CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT ARISING FROM THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE OR FORCE 22 LIKELY TO CAUSE DEATH IN PROTECTING OR ATTEMPTING TO PROTECT THE PERSON
- 23 OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE PERSON'S BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT.
- 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 25 construed retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect any use of
- 26 deadly force or force likely to cause death by a person in the person's business
- 27 establishment occurring on or after January 1, 2001.
