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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Labor and Employment 2 9-682. 3 (a) If there are no individuals who were totally dependent on the deceased 4 covered employee at the time of death, but there are individuals who were partly 5 dependent, the employer or its insurer shall pay death benefit in accordance with this 6 section. 7 The maximum weekly death benefit payable under this section shall (b) (1) 8 equal two-thirds of the average weekly wage of the deceased covered employee, but may not exceed two-thirds of the State average weekly wage. 10 (2) The weekly death benefit payable under this section shall be the 11 percentage of the maximum weekly death benefit under paragraph (1) of this 12 subsection that: 13 the weekly earnings of [each partly dependent individual bear 14 to the average weekly wage of the deceased covered employee] THE DECEASED 15 COVERED EMPLOYEE BEARS TO THE COMBINED WEEKLY EARNINGS OF THE 16 DECEASED COVERED EMPLOYEE AND THE PARTLY DEPENDENT INDIVIDUALS; and 17 (ii) does not exceed the maximum weekly death benefit. (c) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the THE employer or its 18 19 insurer shall pay the weekly death benefit FOR THE PERIOD OF DEPENDENCY: 20 (1) for the period of partial dependency; or 21 (2) until \$45,000 \$75,000 has been paid. 22 (d) f(1)Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, if IF a surviving spouse 23 who is partly dependent remarries and does not have dependent children at the time 24 of the remarriage, the employer or its insurer shall make payments to the surviving spouse for 2 years after the date of the remarriage. 26 f(2)The total of the payments made before the remarriage may not 27 exceed \$45,000 \$75,000.\(\frac{1}{2}\)
