- 3 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the inheritance tax imposed
- 4 <u>under § 7-202 of the Tax General Article does not apply to the receipt of property</u>
- 5 from a decedent who died on January 20, 2002 while in active service of the Armed

- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 8 construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect the
- 9 estates of all decedents who died on January 20, 2002 while in active service of the
- 10 Armed Forces of the United States in Afghanistan.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 12 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
- 13 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
- 14 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
- 15 the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end
- 16 of the 3-year period, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 17 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
