Workers' Compensation - Workers' Compensation Commission - Budget Process

FOR the purpose of requiring the Workers' Compensation Commission to calculate a 4 certain tax before each fiscal year in a certain manner; establishing a Workers' 5 Compensation Fund; requiring the Commission to pay money collected from a 6 certain tax to the Fund; establishing an Advisory Committee on the budget of 7 the Commission; providing for the membership of the Committee; requiring the 8 9 Governor to appoint certain members to the Committee; providing for the 10 appointment of the chairman of the Committee; providing for the terms of the 11 members of the Committee; prohibiting a member of the Advisory Committee 12 from receiving compensation; requiring the Commission to provide certain 13 resources to the Committee; requiring the Commission to prepare a certain 14 tentative operating budget for the Committee; requiring the Committee to 15 review a certain budget and make recommendations to the Commission; 16 requiring the Commission to take certain information into consideration prior to submitting a budget to the Governor; requiring the Governor to take certain 17 18 information into consideration; requiring the Committee to submit a certain 19 report to the Governor and the General Assembly; providing for the composition of the Fund; providing for the purpose of the Fund; requiring the costs of the 20 Commission to be paid out of the State budget; providing for expenditures of the 21 22 Fund; providing for the disposition of certain money in the event of a surplus; 23 providing for an additional assessment in certain circumstances; providing that 24 the State Treasurer is the custodian of the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer 25 to deposit certain money into the Fund; providing that the Fund is a certain type of fund; prohibiting the use of money from the Fund for certain purposes; 26 27 requiring the Commission to pay certain money to the General Fund; and 28 generally relating to workers' compensation.

 (f) The Commission shall pay the money that it collects for the tax under this section into the WORKERS' COMPENSATION FUND IN THE State Treasury ESTABLISHED UNDER § 9-319 OF THIS SUBTITLE to reimburse the State for the expense of administering this title.

5 (A) THERE IS AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE BUDGET OF THE 6 COMMISSION.

7 (B) (1) THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF 12 MEMBERS, APPOINTED 8 BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

9 (2) EACH MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR SERVES AT THE 10 PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNOR.

11(3)THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THE12MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

13 (C) IN MAKING THE APPOINTMENTS, THE GOVERNOR SHALL:

8 TRAVEL AND OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL
9 COMMITTEE DUTIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL
10 REGULATIONS.

11 (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE MEETING SPACE, BUDGET ANALYSIS, 12 AND STAFF SUPPORT FOR THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

14 (A) BY SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL PREPARE A
15 TENTATIVE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR AND SUBMIT IT TO THE

(D) BY DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL
SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS
THAT IT MADE TO THE COMMISSION ON THE COMMISSION'S NEXT FISCAL YEAR
BUDGET.

28 (E) THE GOVERNOR SHALL GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO THE29 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

31 (A) THERE IS A WORKERS' COMPENSATION FUND THAT CONSISTS OF:

32 (1) ALL REVENUE RECEIVED THROUGH THE IMPOSITION AND
 33 COLLECTION OF THE ASSESSMENT TAX UNDER § 9-316 OF THIS SUBTITLE;

34 (2) INCOME FROM INVESTMENTS THAT THE TREASURER MAKES FOR
 35 THE STATE FUND; AND

1(3)ANY OTHER FEE, EXAMINATION ASSESSMENT, OR REVENUE2RECEIVED BY THE COMMISSION UNDER THIS TITLE.

3 (B) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSION
4 SHALL PAY ALL FINES AND PENALTIES COLLECTED BY THE COMMISSION UNDER
5 THIS TITLE INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.

6 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO PAY ALL:

7 (1) THE COSTS AND EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE COMMISSION THAT 8 ARE RELATED TO THE OPERATION OF THE COMMISSION, INCLUDING:

9 (1) (I) EXPENDITURES AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS TITLE;

10(2)(II)THE COST OF STATE EMPLOYEES SPECIFICALLY ASSIGNED TO11THE COMMISSION; AND

12 (3) (III) REASONABLE EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE ADVISORY
 13 COMMITTEE ON THE BUDGET OF THE COMMISSION ESTABLISHED UNDER § 9-317 OF
 14 THIS SUBTITLE; AND

15 (4) (2) ANY OTHER EXPENSE AUTHORIZED IN THE STATE BUDGET,
 16 INCLUDING COSTS SPECIFIED UNDER § 9-315 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

17 (D) (1) ALL THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE 18 INCLUDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

19(2)ANY EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND TO COVER COSTS AND20EXPENSES OF THE COMMISSION MAY ONLY BE MADE:

21 (I) WITH AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE FUND APPROVED BY THE 22 GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET; OR

23 (II) BY THE BUDGET AMENDMENT PROCEDURE PROVIDED FOR IN § 24 7-209 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

(3) (I) IF, IN ANY GIVEN FISCAL YEAR, THE AMOUNT OF THE REVENUE
COLLECTED BY THE COMMISSION AND DEPOSITED INTO THE FUND EXCEEDS THE
ACTUAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE COMMISSION, PLUS AN ADDITIONAL 1 PERCENT
PROVISION FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENDITURES OVER THE ACTUAL
APPROPRIATION FOR THE COMMISSION, THE EXCESS AMOUNT SHALL BE CARRIED
FORWARD WITHIN THE FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF REDUCING THE ASSESSMENT
FEE IMPOSED BY THE COMMISSION FOR THE FOLLOWING FISCAL YEAR.

(II) IF, IN ANY GIVEN YEAR, THE AMOUNT OF REVENUE COLLECTED
BY THE COMMISSION AND DEPOSITED INTO THE FUND IS INSUFFICIENT TO COVER
THE EXPENDITURES OF THE COMMISSION BECAUSE OF AN UNFORESEEN
EMERGENCY AND EXPENDITURES ARE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BUDGET
AMENDMENT PROCEDURE PROVIDED FOR IN § 7-209 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND

PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, AN ADDITIONAL ASSESSMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURES
 MAY BE MADE.

3 (E) (1) THE STATE TREASURER IS THE CUSTODIAN OF THE FUND.

4 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DEPOSIT PAYMENTS RECEIVED FROM 5 THE COMMISSION INTO THE FUND.

6 (F) (1) THE FUND IS A CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND AND IS NOT
7 SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, AND MAY
8 NOT BE DEEMED A PART OF THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.

9 (2) UNLESS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, NO PART OF THE FUND MAY 10 REVERT OR BE CREDITED TO:

11 (I) THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE; OR

12 (II) A SPECIAL FUND OF THE STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October June 1, 2002.
