1(11	(ii) The fund is a continuing, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7-302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

	4 (4) The Department of Human Resources, with oversight by the 5 Commission, shall disburse the funds in accordance with the provisions of this 5 section.
	(5) In any year when there are unexpended funds, those funds shall be returned to the customer classes proportionate to how the customer classes paid into the fund.
22	 (6) Notwithstanding paragraph (5) of this subsection, the Commission may retain any unexpended funds in the fund at the end of [June 30, 2001] ANY GIVEN FISCAL YEAR and make the funds available for disbursement through [June 30, 2002] THE END OF THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR to electric customers who:
