### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Stadium License - Sale of Liquor

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding the scope of the Harford County stadium alcoholic
- beverages license to include the sale of liquor under certain circumstances; 4
- 5 expanding the scope of the individuals and entities to whom the stadium license
- may be issued; defining certain terms; setting forth certain limitations with 6
- 7 respect to where liquor may be served during baseball games, the kinds of
- containers that alcoholic beverages must be served in, and the kinds of 8
- dispensers to be used for alcoholic beverages; increasing the annual fee for the 9
- 10 stadium alcoholic beverages license; requiring the prior written approval of the
- 11 Harford County Liquor Control Board for certain activities; making stylistic
- 12 changes; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the
- Harford County stadium alcoholic beverages license. 13

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF



#### 1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 8-213.1. 3 (a) This section applies only in Harford County. There is a stadium [beer and light wine] on-sale license in Harford 4 (b) 5 County. 6 The Liquor Control Board may issue a stadium [beer and light wine (c) (1) 7 on-sale license] ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE FOR A STADIUM OWNED BY THE 8 CITY OF ABERDEEN COVERING ON-PREMISES SALE OF BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR to 9 the owner [or lessee], LESSEE, OR CONCESSION MANAGER of a professional baseball 10 stadium for use on the [stadium] LICENSED premises. 11 (2) FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION: 12 "CONCESSION MANAGER" MEANS A SINGLE INDIVIDUAL OR (I) 13 SINGLE ENTITY CONTRACTUALLY OBLIGATED TO PROVIDE AND SUPERVISE 14 COMPREHENSIVE MANAGEMENT OF ALL FOOD AND BEVERAGE SALES BY 15 CONCESSIONAIRES ON THE LICENSED PREMISES; AND "LICENSED PREMISES" INCLUDES THE STADIUM FACILITY AND 16 (II)17 STADIUM PARKING LOTS. [A] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 18 (d) (1)19 SUBSECTION, A stadium [beer and light wine on-sale] ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES 20 license authorizes the holder to sell beer [and, if sold with a meal, light wine], WINE, 21 AND LIQUOR on the licensed premises: 22 [(1)](I) For consumption only on the licensed premises; 23 In a plastic, styrofoam, or paper container, except that a glass 24 container may be used in an enclosed dining area in which patrons are seated; 25 (3) To a person present: 26 (i) At a baseball game in which the team of the licensee or lessee is 27 playing; or 28 (ii) At another event that is held at the stadium;] and 29 [(4)](II)During the hours and days for sale specified in § 11-513 of this 30 article. 31 THE SALE, SERVING, OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES 32 ON THE PARKING LOTS OF THE STADIUM MAY BE ALLOWED ONLY WITH THE PRIOR 33 WRITTEN APPROVAL OF THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
