- 6 and any liens or encumbrances against the land or the structures must be acceptable 7 to the Trust.]
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an 9 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health 10 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the 11 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take 12 effect from the date it is enacted.
