A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Baltimore City - Orphans' Court Judges - Salary and Pensions

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the salary of the Chief Judge and the associate judges of
- 4 the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; altering the annual pension or salary for
- 5 certain retired judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; providing that
- 6 this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent Chief
- Judge and the associate judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; and
- 8 generally relating to the salary and pension of certain judges of the Orphans'
- 9 Court for Baltimore City.
- 10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 11 Article Estates and Trusts
- 12 Section 2-108(d)
- 13 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 14 (2001 Replacement Volume and 2001 Supplement)
- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 Article - Estates and Trusts

- 18 2-108.
- 19 (d) (1) (i) Each associate judge of the Court of Baltimore City shall receive
- 20 an annual compensation of [\$50,000] \$55,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an
- 21 annual compensation of [\$60,000] \$65,000.
- 22 (ii) Each associate judge who was in active service on or after
- 23 January 1, 1984 shall be paid after the termination of active service, if he is then at
- 24 least 60 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary
- 25 calculated at the rate of [\$2,500] \$5,000 annually for each year, or a part of a year, of
- 26 active service; but the maximum pension or salary for the service by an associate
- 27 judge may not exceed [\$25,000] \$50,000 annually.

SENATE BILL 865

- 1 (iii) Each Chief Judge who was in active service on or after January
- 2 1, 1984, shall be paid, after the termination of active service, if he is then at least 60
- 3 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary calculated at
- 4 the rate of [\$3,000] \$6,000 annually for each year, or a part of a year of active service;
- 5 but the maximum pension or salary for the service by a Chief Judge may not exceed
- 6 [\$30,000] \$60,000 annually. The pension or salary shall be paid by the City of
- 7 Baltimore in the same manner as the salaries of the judges of the Court for the City
- 8 are paid.
- 9 (2) The surviving spouse of every elected judge of the Court of Baltimore
- 10 City shall be paid one half of the pension to which his spouse was entitled at the time
- 11 of his death, or would have become entitled to by reason of attaining 60 years of age.
- 12 In each instance, the pension shall be paid to the spouse until remarriage or death.
- 13 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply in the case of a spouse who was
- 14 married to a sitting judge for a period of less than three years prior to his death, and
- 15 to a retired judge for a period less than three years before his retirement.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,
- 17 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or
- 18 apply to the salary or compensation of the Chief Judge and the associate judges of the
- 19 Orphans' Court for Baltimore City in office on the effective date of this Act, but the
- 20 provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the Chief Judge and
- 21 the associate judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City shall take effect at the
- 22 beginning of the next following term of office.
- 23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 October 1, 2002.
