4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14	FOR the purpose of altering the salary of the Chief Judge and the associate judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; altering the annual pension or salary for certain retired judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent Chief Judge and the associate judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; and generally relating to the salary and pension of certain judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City.  BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Estates and Trusts Section 2-108(d) Annotated Code of Maryland (2001 Replacement Volume and 2001 Supplement)  SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 19 20 a	2-108.  (d) (1) (i) Each associate judge of the Court of Baltimore City shall receive an annual compensation of [\$50,000] \$55,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual compensation of [\$60,000] \$65,000.

- 1 (ii) Each associate judge who was in active service on or after
- 2 January 1, 1984 shall be paid after the termination of active service, if he is then at
- 3 least 60 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary
- 4 calculated at the rate of \{\\$2,500\}\\$5,000 annually for each year, or a part of a year, of
- 5 active service; but the maximum pension or salary for the service by an associate
- 6 judge may not exceed [\$25,000] \$50,000 annually.
- 7 (iii) Each Chief Judge who was in active service on or after January
- 8 1, 1984, shall be paid, after the termination of active service, if he is then at least 60
- 9 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary calculated at
- 10 the rate of {\$3,000} \$6,000 annually for each year, or a part of a year of active service;
- 11 but the maximum pension or salary for the service by a Chief Judge may not exceed
- 12 [\$30,000] \$60,000 annually. The pension or salary shall be paid by the City of
- 13 Baltimore in the same manner as the salaries of the judges of the Court for the City
- 14 are paid.
- 15 (2) The surviving spouse of every elected judge of the Court of Baltimore
- 16 City shall be paid one half of the pension to which his spouse was entitled at the time
- 17 of his death, or would have become entitled to by reason of attaining 60 years of age.
- 18 In each instance, the pension shall be paid to the spouse until remarriage or death.
- 19 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply in the case of a spouse who was
- 20 married to a sitting judge for a period of less than three years prior to his death, and
- 21 to a retired judge for a period less than three years before his retirement.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,
- 23 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or
- 24 apply to the salary or compensation of the Chief Judge and the associate judges of the
- 25 Orphans' Court for Baltimore City in office on the effective date of this Act, but the
- 26 provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the Chief Judge and
- 27 the associate judges of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City shall take effect at the
- 28 beginning of the next following term of office.
- 29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 October 1, 2002.
