- 3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to alter
- 4 the length of a term for judges of the Orphans' Courts; submitting this
- 5 amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or
- 6 rejection; and generally relating to the term of office for judges of the Orphans'
- 7 Courts.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses
- 20 concurring), That it be proposed that the Constitution of Maryland read as follows:

21 Article IV - Judiciary Department

- 23 The qualified voters of the City of Baltimore, and of the several Counties, except
- 24 Montgomery County and Harford County, shall elect three Judges of the Orphans'
- 25 Courts of City and Counties, respectively, who shall be citizens of the State and
- 26 residents, for the twelve months preceding, in the City or County for which they may
- 27 be elected. EACH JUDGE SHALL HOLD THE OFFICE OF JUDGE OF THE ORPHANS'
- 28 COURT FOR A TERM OF TEN YEARS FROM THE TIME OF ELECTION, AND UNTIL A

- 1 SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIED. They shall have all the powers now vested
- 2 in the Orphans' Courts of the State, subject to such changes as the Legislature may
- 3 prescribe. Each of the Judges shall be paid such compensation as may be regulated by
- 4 Law, to be paid by the City or Counties, respectively. In case of a vacancy in the office
- 5 of Judge of the Orphans' Court, the Governor shall appoint, subject to confirmation or
- 6 rejection by the Senate, some suitable person to fill the vacancy for the residue of the 7 term.

Article XVII - Quadrennial Elections

- 10 All State and county officers elected by qualified voters (except JUDGES OF THE
- 11 ORPHANS' COURTS, judges of the Circuit Courts, judges of the Supreme Bench of
- 12 Baltimore City, judges of the Court of Appeals and judges of any intermediate courts
- $13\,$ of appeal) shall hold office for terms of four years, and until their successors shall
- 14 qualify.
- 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
- 16 determines that the amendment to the Constitution of Maryland proposed by this Act
- 17 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, Section 1 of the
- 18 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.
- 19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section
- 20 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of Maryland shall be submitted to the
- 21 legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in
- 22 November, 2002 for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of directions contained in
- 23 Article XIV of the Constitution of this State. At that general election, the vote on this
- 24 proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot
- 25 there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against
- 26 the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the
- 27 election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the
- 28 proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Constitution, and further
- 29 proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
