A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Prince George's Hospital System Improvement Task Force

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Prince George's Hospital System Improvement

- 4 Task Force; providing for the composition of the Task Force; requiring the
- 5 Governor to appoint the chairman of the Task Force; providing for staffing for
- 6 the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving
- 7 compensation while authorizing members of the Task Force to receive
- 8 reimbursement for expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make
- 9 recommendations about certain issues; requiring the Task Force to submit a
- 10 certain report to certain parties on or before a certain date; providing for the
- 11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Prince George's Hospital
- 12 System Improvement Task Force.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That:

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

13 October 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of

14 September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this

15 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
