- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Public Service Commission from issuing a
- 4 certificate of public convenience and necessity for the construction of an electric
- 5 generating station until Maryland achieves compliance with the ozone standard
- 6 required by the Environmental Protection Agency; requiring the Department of
- 7 the Environment to provide certain notice to the Commission; and generally
- 8 relating to electric generating station construction.

- 14 Preamble
- WHEREAS, Maryland is not in attainment of the national primary ambient
- 16 quality standard for ozone under the federal Clean Air Act; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Other states such as Kentucky and Tennessee have restricted
- 18 power plant construction in an effort to address ozone and related air pollution
- 19 concerns; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The citizens of Maryland and Frederick County are concerned
- 21 about quality of the air in Maryland; now, therefore,
- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Public Utility Companies

- 3 THE COMMISSION MAY NOT ISSUE A CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE
- 4 AND NECESSITY FOR AN ELECTRIC GENERATING STATION UNTIL THE STATE
- 5 ACHIEVES OVERALL COMPLIANCE WITH THE NATIONAL PRIMARY AMBIENT AIR
- 6 QUALITY STANDARD FOR OZONE REQUIRED BY THE UNITED STATES
- 7 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY UNDER 42 U.S.C. § 7511A AND RELATED
- 8 PROVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN AIR ACT AMENDMENTS OF 1990.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of the
- 10 Environment shall notify the Public Service Commission of the State's achievement of
- 11 the national primary ambient air quality standard for ozone under this Act
- 12 immediately on receiving notification of that achievement from the United States
- 13 Environmental Protection Agency.
- 14 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 October 1, 2002.
