SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Maryland Day of Remembrance of the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks
- 3 FOR the purpose of designating September 11 as "Maryland Day of Remembrance of
- 4 the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks".
- 5 WHEREAS, On September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked and destroyed four
- 6 civilian aircraft, crashing two of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in
- 7 New York City, and a third into the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C.; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Thousands of innocent Americans were killed and injured as a
- 9 result of these attacks, including the passengers and crew of the four aircraft,
- 10 workers in the World Trade Center and in the Pentagon, rescue workers, and
- 11 bystanders; and
- 12 WHEREAS, These attacks destroyed both towers of the World Trade Center, as
- 13 well as adjacent buildings, and seriously damaged the Pentagon; and
- 14 WHEREAS, These attacks were by far the deadliest terrorist attacks ever
- 15 launched against the United States, and, by targeting symbols of American strength
- 16 and success, clearly were intended to intimidate our nation and weaken its resolve;
- 17 now, therefore, be it

- 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 2 General Assembly of Maryland wishes to honor those firefighters, police officers, and
- 3 citizens who risked their lives to rescue people trapped in the towers of the World
- 4 Trade Center and in the Pentagon, and who worked tirelessly to clear the wreckage
- 5 and to recover the bodies of people killed; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly wishes to honor those heroes aboard
- 7 United Airlines flight 93, who gave their lives in the skies over Pennsylvania in a
- 8 valiant struggle to prevent the terrorist hijackers from using the aircraft as a weapon
- 9 of mass destruction in our Nation's Capital, thereby thwarting the terrorists' goal of
- 10 striking at the most precious symbols of American democracy, the U.S. Capitol and
- 11 the White House; and be it further
- 12 <u>RESOLVED, That</u> the General Assembly of Maryland designates September 11
- 13 as "Maryland Day of Remembrance of the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks"; and
- 14 be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 16 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 17 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 18 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
