## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

## 2 American Patriotism in Maryland Schools

- 3 FOR the purpose of urging the boards of education in the State of Maryland to
- 4 introduce instruction to encourage patriotism by including curriculum on or
- 5 before Veterans' Day and Memorial Day regarding the sacrifices made by
- 6 veterans in serving our country and protecting democratic values worldwide,
- and to encourage the inclusion of local veterans and veterans' groups in this
- 8 instruction when practicable.
- 9 WHEREAS, The services provided to this country by veterans who have served
- 10 on active duty in the military are deserving of special recognition among our school
- 11 children; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Until the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on the World Trade
- 13 Center and the Pentagon, several generations of relative peace and prosperity in the
- 14 nation dulled the recognition of the extraordinary sacrifices of those heroes who
- 15 served in uniform; and
- WHEREAS, The military response of the United States to that cowardly attack
- 17 on innocent countrymen has, yet again, placed the service men and women of the
- 18 armed services in harm's way defending our nation, its citizens, and our ideals; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Children in the United States have been blessed, due to the valor of
- 20 American service men and women, never to have known firsthand the pain and
- 21 suffering endured by those in military service who have protected the United States
- 22 from its adversaries in the past; and

- WHEREAS, The population of veterans, especially those who fought during
- 2 World War II and the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, is aging and students in
- 3 Maryland schools may, therefore, not have had the opportunity to know or come in
- 4 contact with those in our society who served; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the local
- 6 boards of education throughout Maryland are respectfully urged to develop and
- 7 institute a curriculum on or before Veterans' Day or Memorial Day designed to instill
- 8 a sense of patriotism and an awareness of the great sacrifices made by veterans of the
- 9 United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, National Guard,
- 10 and Maryland National Guard to preserve and promote liberty and democratic values
- 11 worldwide; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 13 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 14 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 15 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
