SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2

Medicare Coverage of Oral Cancer Drugs

3 FOR the purpose of urging the Congress of the United States to adopt legislation

requiring the Medicare program to cover all oral anticancer drugs; directing that 4

5 this resolution be forwarded to certain persons; and generally relating to

6 Medicare coverage of oral cancer drugs.

7 WHEREAS, Cancer is a leading cause of morbidity and mortality in the State of 8 Maryland and throughout the nation; and

9 WHEREAS, Cancer is disproportionately a disease of the elderly, with more

10 than half of all cancer diagnoses occurring in individuals age 65 or older, who are thus 11 dependent on the federal Medicare program for provision of cancer care; and

12 WHEREAS, Treatment with anticancer drugs is the cornerstone of modern

13 cancer care, and elderly cancer patients must have access to potentially

14 life-extending drug therapy, but the Medicare program's coverage of drugs is limited

15 to injectable drugs or oral drugs that have an injectable version; and

16 WHEREAS, The nation's investment in biomedical research has begun to bear 17 fruit with a compelling array of new oral anticancer drugs that are less toxic, more effective, and more cost-effective than existing therapies, but, because such drugs do 18 not have an injectable equivalent, they are not covered by Medicare; and 19

20 WHEREAS, Noncoverage of these important new products leaves many

21 Medicare beneficiaries confronting the choice of either substantial out-of-pocket

22 personal costs or the selection of more toxic, less effective treatments that are covered 23 by the program; and

24 WHEREAS, Medicare's failure to cover anticancer drugs leaves at risk many 25 beneficiaries suffering from blood-related cancers like leukemia, lymphoma, and 26 myeloma, as well as cancers of the breast, lung, and prostate; and

27 WHEREAS, Certain members of the United States Congress have recognized

28 the necessity of Medicare coverage for all oral anticancer drugs and introduced 29 legislation in the 107th Congress to achieve that result (H.R. 1624; S. 913); now,

30 therefore, be it

2 General Assembly of Maryland urges the Congress of the United States to adopt

3 legislation requiring the Medicare program to cover all oral anticancer drugs; and be
