#### **FISCAL NOTE**

Senate Bill 870 (Senator Green) Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### **Elections - Form of Petitions**

This bill requires the State and local election boards to seek the advice of a legal authority when determining the legal sufficiency of the format of a petition submitted in advance of filing for inclusion on the ballot.

The bill is effective July 1, 2002.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Increased paperwork and other administrative costs associated with modest increases in referrals to attorneys could be handled within the existing budgeted resources of the State Board of Elections.

**Local Effect:** Most counties would be able to handle the bill's requirements with existing budgeted resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** State law allows election boards to seek legal advice on the final form of a petition, but does not require it.

**Local Fiscal Effect:** Caroline County advises that the bill would require a substantial increase in expenditures because the Caroline County attorney's rate is \$200 per hour.
