#### **FISCAL NOTE**

House Bill 631 (Dorchester County Delegation)

Commerce and Government Matters

#### **Environment - Dorchester County - Sanitary Commission**

This bill reduces the term of office for members of the Dorchester County Sanitary Commission from six to four years and sets December 1 as the last day of a member's term. The bill also provides that for commissioners appointed on or after December 1, 2002 two commissioners will have two-year terms expiring on December 1, 2003, two commissioners will have three-year terms expiring on December 1, 2005, and one commissioner will have a four-year term expiring on December 1, 2006.

# **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** Changing the term of office for sanitary commissioners would not affect Dorchester County finances.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Dorchester County Sanitary Commissioners serve six-year terms with the last day of their term set on July 1 of the appropriate year. Sanitary commissioners in Allegany, Dorchester, Garrett, Kent, and Somerset counties also serve six-year terms.

**Background:** The Dorchester County Sanitary Commission has five members, meets monthly, and is charged with providing safe and reliable water to consumers and returning clean water to the environment.
