House Bill 871

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Elections - Provisional Ballots - Confirmation of the Status of Ballots

This bill requires local boards of elections to send a voter who voted using a provisional ballot, written confirmation of whether the ballot cast was accepted or rejected by the board and include an explanation in the case of a rejected ballot. A voter must request a confirmation within ten days after an election.

The bill is effective July 1, 2002.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not directly affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: Minimal. Most jurisdictions could handle any additional expenditures for recordkeeping, postage, and handling within their existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: State law requires a voter to cast a provisional ballot if the voter is not listed as a registered voter, but has made a good-faith effort to register at a voter registration agency. There are no provisions that require a local election board to notify a voter of a ballot's disposition.
