House Joint Resolution 31 Environmental Matters (Delegate Gladden, et al.)

The AIDS Epidemic in Africa

This joint resolution urges the United States President and Congress to advise pharmaceutical companies to provide life saving drugs at low cost to Africans infected with HIV and AIDS.

Fiscal Summary

Analysis

Current Law: None applicable.

Background: Africa is home to 70% of the adults and 80% of the children living with HIV in the world. Approximately 17 million Africans have died of AIDS over the past 20 years and HIV/AIDS is now the leading cause of death in sub-Saharan Africa. It is estimated that 28.1 million adults and children are living with HIV/AIDS. AIDS deaths totaled 3 million globally in 2001, of which 2.3 million occurred in Africa. It is estimated that by the year 2010, there will be 40 million AIDS orphans in Africa.
