Assisted Living Programs - Implementation of Regulations Concerning Survey and Complaint Reporting

This bill requires an assisted living facility to conspicuously post in a public place accessible to actual and potential patients the following material: (1) the facility's statement of deficiencies for the most recent survey; (2) any subsequent complaint investigations conducted by federal, State, or local surveyors; and (3) any plans of correction in effect. If the facility does not post these items, it must post a notice of their location. The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) must incorporate this requirement into regulations.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The adoption of regulations could be handled with existing DHMH resources. No effect on revenues.

Analysis

Current Law: An assisted living program is a residential or facility-based program that provides housing and supportive services, supervision, personalized assistance, health-related services, or a combination of these services to meet the needs of residents who are unable to perform, or who need assistance in performing, the activities of daily living or instrumental activities of daily living.

The Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ) within DHMH is responsible for the licensure and regulation of assisted living programs. OHCQ conducts at least annual inspections (surveys) of assisted living facilities to ensure compliance with regulations. If a complaint investigation or survey inspection identifies a regulatory violation, OHCQ may issue a deficiency statement against the facility: (1) citing the violation; (2) requiring the facility to submit an acceptable plan of correction, including the date by which the facility must make the correction; and (3) notifying the facility that failure to correct the violation could result in sanctions.
