Prince George's County - Law Enforcement - Settlement Reports

This bill requires Prince George's County to report annually to the County Council and General Assembly on the total number of settlements of tort claims involving law enforcement activities in the county and the total expenditures made in the preceding fiscal year for those settlements.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: It is expected that the reporting requirements of this bill could be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: A Citizen Complaint Oversight Panel, consisting of seven appointed residents of the county, has been established by the Local Laws of Prince George's County to review the processing of complaints of excessive force, abusive language, or harassment, and to comment on the action taken on such complaints. The panel must report its recommendations to the Chief Administrative Officer upon the final disposition of each case and issue an annual report to the public. There are no State laws requiring reporting of law enforcement-related claims or settlements.

Background: Prince George's County settles some complaints out-of-court by monetary payment, without an admission of blame or guilt, and seals the settlement agreement as a matter of practice.
