Prince George's County - Democratic Party Central Committee - Composition

This bill expands the membership of the Prince George's County Democratic Party Central Committee from 21 to 23.

The bill is effective June 1, 2002.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill's changes could be made by the State Board of Elections using existing budgeted resources.

Local Effect: Prince George's County would be able to implement the bill's requirements using existing budgeted resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill requires two additional committee members to be elected from an eighth State legislative district located in Prince George's County. The bill also requires that members be elected from each single-member or two-member subdistrict in the county.

Current Law: The Prince George's County Democratic Central Committee comprises 21 members. Fourteen are elected from the county's seven State legislative districts (two per district), and seven are elected from the county at-large. Redrawn State legislative

districts went into effect on February 22, 2002 pursuant to Article III of the Maryland Constitution.
