House Bill 383 (Delegate Glassman, et al.)
Commerce and Government Matters Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs
Campaign Finance Law - Reporting Requirements

This bill alters the date of the annual campaign finance report from November to the third Wednesday in January. It repeals the requirement for a political committee to file a report six months after a general election where a cash balance, unpaid debt, or deficits remain and requires the annual report to be filed in a general election year.

## Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The additional report and increased postage costs for pre-report notifications could be handled with the existing resources of the State Board of Elections.

Local Effect: None.
Small Business Effect: None.

## Analysis

Current Law: Political committees are required under State law to file four financial disclosure reports in an election year on the following schedule:

- the fourth Tuesday preceding a primary election;
- the second Friday preceding a primary election;
- the second Friday preceding a general election; and
- the third Tuesday after the general election.

An annual report is required of political committees during non-election years. An additional report is required six months after a general election if a cash balance, unpaid bills, or deficit remains in a campaign account.
