Health Care - Programs and Facilities - Pain Management

This bill establishes a 13-member State Advisory Council on Pain Management. The council must provide advice and recommendations with respect to pain management policy. The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene will designate staff for the council. The council must issue an interim report by September 30, 2003, and a final report by September 30, 2004, to the General Assembly that includes recommendations on pain management issues in Maryland.
