#### **Sheppard Pratt Hospital - Facility Replacement Project**

This joint resolution expresses support for the Sheppard Pratt Hospital in its efforts to secure an appropriation from the United States Congress for its hospital. It encourages Congress to respond favorably to Sheppard Pratt's request for funding support.

## Analysis

Sheppard Pratt may seek federal appropriations to fund its capital Current Law: projects.

Background: Sheppard Pratt Hospital, located in Towson, Maryland, was founded as a part of the 19<sup>th</sup> century reform movement that advocated for humane treatment of the mentally ill. The hospital is a statewide resource that admits approximately 5,000 inpatients annually, representing 14% of all non-State system psychiatric hospitalizations in Maryland. The hospital specializes in trauma disorders, geriatric services, treatmentresistant psychotic disorders, and dual diagnosis treatment for chemical dependency and mental illness. Sheppard Pratt is seeking a state-of-the-art facility to provide patient care.
